Course Description

Musculoskeletal diseases are among the most common conditions on why patients present to primary care providers. In 30-50% of visits to their practices, patients present because of musculoskeletal complaints. Primary care providers are challenged to meet the triple aim in this population including over imaging and medicalization. The physical therapist is uniquely positioned to be part of the primary care team. Physical Therapists working in primary care can lower imaging orders, improve outcomes for routine primary care visits and improve appropriate use of PT services for musculoskeletal (MSK) care.

Objectives

- Define the role of a physical therapist working in a medical home team in primary care.
- Identify the unique challenges for a primary care practice as a physical therapist.
- Demonstrate the importance of clinical decision making and treatment options for musculoskeletal (MSK) patients.
- Explore future direction including expanding primary care physical therapy to non-musculoskeletal diagnosis.

Dan Kang, PT, DPT

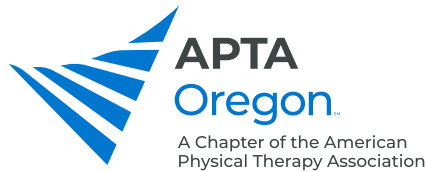
