9:00 - 11:00 AM KEYNOTE SPEAKER Tendon Rehab: Application of Current Best Evidence for Conservative Management Presented by Karl Kolbkeck, PT



The past decade has been instrumental in providing evidence in tendon lesion management-primarily focused on lower extremity chronic tendinopathy. The eccentric loading 'panacea' has been challenged and research supports the necessity of heavy slow load not only through the eccentric phase but the concentric phase of the exercise as well. Isometrics have also been investigated as a means to modulate tendon pain; with mixed conclusions on its efficacy. This lecture will avoid cherry-picking the evidence to support a biased belief. It will compare and contrast the research to provide the attendee with information to formulate a practical evidence-supported rehab program for their patient.

Course Objectives:

- Understand the fundamentals of the pathophysiology of tendon injury.
- Acute tendinitis...sometimes unloading tissue is the appropriate load. Gain perspective as to when and why to unload pathological tendon.
- Do modalities have their place in tendon pathology management?
- · Appreciate compressive tendons and unique perspectives on management.
- Gain an understanding of Heavy Slow Resistance Training (HSRT) and the application of rep-max formulas to establish appropriate resistance loads.
- · Apply best-evidence supported rehab programs to your patients with a tendon injury.
